Vieira's work on programs such as *The Today Show*, *The View*, *Who Wants to Be a Millionaire*, 60 Minutes, and West 57th has cemented her legacy as one of the most influential figures in broadcasting. A Broadcasting & Cable Hall of Fame inductee, she continues to inspire the next generation of journalists and media professionals.

"I am so honored and humbled to be recognized by my peers in the region that shaped my values and vaulted my career," said Vieira. "Thank you New England for the opportunity you gave me to spend a lifetime telling stories that matter."

The Governors' Award is the highest honor bestowed by the NATAS chapters. It is awarded to individuals, organizations, or companies with ties to the region whose achievements extend beyond traditional award categories, recognizing those who have made a profound and lasting impact on the industry. Past chapter honorees include John King, Leonard Nimoy, Vin Di Bona, Rex Trailer, David Muir, Caroll Spinney, and Julia Child.

"Meredith's contributions to journalism and broadcasting are exemplary," says Kathryn Shehade, President of the NATAS Boston/New England Chapter. "Her ability to connect with audiences, her commitment to journalistic integrity, and her influence on both news and entertainment make her uniquely iconic. A native of Providence, Rhode Island, Vieira graduated with a degree in English from the prestigious Tufts University in Medford, Massachusetts. She began her career in broadcasting in 1975 as a news announcer for WORC radio in Worcester, Massachusetts. She later worked as a

local reporter and anchor at WJAR-TV in Providence before launching into national prominence. In addition to her television career, Vieira is the founder and CEO of Meredith Vieira Productions, developing and producing film, television, and theatre projects.

The 2025 New England Emmy® Awards Gala will bring together hundreds of television industry professionals from across New England. The evening will begin with a cocktail reception at 5 p.m., followed by the award presentations at 6 p.m.
